

SSBC Scope of Events for Volunteers

This is a general outline of what you would be signing up to do at the various events as a volunteer. The success of this boating club relies on everyone pitching in to help with an event so that they become easier to plan and run, making it more fun for everyone involved.

Game Nights (Crazy Bridge, White Elephant Bingo, Jenga, etc) – Help with setting up the games the night of the events, arrange for light snacks and help clean up after the event. Usually one pre-meeting is scheduled by the coordinator who is generally a Club Board Member.

Cruise Events – The Coordinator will iron out the original details of finding the right Marina. Volunteers are needed to help plan and setup a Dock Party and schedule dinner reservations for one night.

Land Based Dock Parties, Cookouts and Dinner events – These usually require a large group of volunteers to split up the duties. It could entail booking a caterer or purchasing supplies for cooking at the event. Also helping to decorate the venue.

Raft Up Party – with the transition of the annual Clam Boil now being just a land based event, we want to still capture the fun of pulling boats up to a sandy beach like Pelican Island for a few hours of fun in the sun. We envision this being more of a short notice event and getting the word out to meet at a designated location and BYOB and snacks. Volunteers will help welcome boats to the Raft Up and make sure we pick up before leaving.

Southport Wooden Boat Show – As we are probably now one of the largest member boating clubs in the area, we would like to volunteer our help this year for this growing event in Southport. It might be as simple as volunteering to man a booth for a few hours.

Southport Christmas Flotilla – We should try to have at least two or three boats entered into this great but small event. As a volunteer you are not signing your boat up for the event (but you can), you are signing up to help decorate the SSBC entries into the Flotilla.
