

Safety Volunteers Saturday - 5:00 PM // Sunday - 8:00 AM & 11:00 AM

- Please arrive no later than a ½ hour before Mass begins. A little before that would be helpful to review and decipher roles.
- A face mask is required. Please bring your own if possible. You will be given a paper “nametag” that will read “Safety Volunteer.”
- Your principal role is to guide & assist those coming to participate at Mass.
- You should not make physical contact with parishioners. Please avoid socializing with the people as they enter. The goal is to get them seated as soon as possible.
- The people will enter by the main front doors or the southwest carport door. These doors plus the center interior doors need to be propped open to limit contact with door handles.
- As people arrive, a Safety Volunteer will be stationed at the main front entrance and another at the carport entrance. Please ensure that everyone is wearing a face mask (ages 5 and up). For those who have not brought their own, masks will be available.
- Two more Safety Volunteers will be positioned in the area in front of the center interior doors (near the holy water fonts which will be empty). Each volunteer will have a clip board with the roster of names with reserved seating. Ask for and check off the person (family’s) name and tell them their assigned section and pew number. For example, B 4. Parishioners should proceed immediately to their assigned pews. (Review seating chart)
- There will be hand sanitizers near the entrances and baskets for people to place their contributions. (There will not be a collection during Mass.)
- While waiting for Mass to begin, individuals who wish may light a votive candle while maintaining social distance (blue tape markings on the floor will indicate this).
- Parishioners have been asked to arrive early. Roughly 5 minutes after Mass begins, the outer doors are to be closed and are locked.
- In the event that there is more seating available because the pre-registration did not fill the seating capacity for a particular Mass,

non-registered people who may happen to come can be seated in the remaining pew sections, provided this doesn't exceed the total capacity allowed.

-When Mass is ready to begin, Father will make a simple entrance from the sacristy. Altar servers, Ushers, Greeters and Eucharistic Ministers will not be functioning in their roles at this time.

-There will be 4 folding chairs available for the Safety Volunteers unless you plan to sit with family members during the Mass itself.

-Communion will only be ministered by the priests. They will come to the people in the pews for distribution. (No Communion procession in the aisles.) Communion from the cup cannot be offered.

-After the final blessing, people must remain in their pews. Safety Volunteers will dismiss the people, pew by pew, starting from the rear of church. This is to maintain social distancing and to avoid socializing.

2 volunteers can stand in the back center aisle and begin to dismiss the people from sections A & B, moving forward pew by pew.

Another volunteer can start with the rear pew in section D to dismiss people through the southeast side door. When finished with section D, continue with the front pew in section B.

The 4th volunteer can be in the west vestibule encouraging people to exit if needed.

-Socializing with people other than family members should only be done outside the church building while observing the social distancing rule. This is to avoid groups mingling in church and losing social distance.

-Bulletins are not distributed. Available on parish website (Monday morning) or mailed by request.

-At various points in the liturgy, Fr. Charlie will be giving directions to the congregation as needed.
