



LCC Covid Sunday Morning Modifications 09/2020

- Online and call-in reservations will be used each week to ensure we are able to serve all interested in attending in a socially distant manner. A new link to RSVP will be provided each week in multiple ways.
 - These sign ins will be used for attendance purposes and used for contact tracing if/when necessary.
- To accommodate social distancing inside the sanctuary, capacity has been reduced to 80. Overflow seating will be provided in the event it becomes necessary.
 - People are encouraged to enjoy the service via live stream when ill, if they can't/won't wear a mask and if they wish to avoid potential exposure.
- Safety signage as recommended will be placed throughout the building, as well as easily accessible hand sanitizing stations.
- Food/Beverages will no longer be served inside the building to avoid the congregating that tends to occur, as well as the removal of masks to partake.
- People will be encouraged to arrive no earlier than 10 minutes before the service is to begin to avoid congregating or “bottlenecks” at check in.
- Upon arrival, greeters will offer hand sanitizer and ushers will lead people to their seats (while maintaining staggered arrival). Ushers will also ensure seating of each party remains 6 feet apart.
 - At this time, masks will be provided for those without and mask policy will be reinforced if necessary.
- Offering plates will not be used. People are encouraged to tithe electronically or utilize the giving boxes at the entrances to the sanctuary.

- Singing will be at the end of service and done with masks in place. An opportunity for those who wish to leave prior to singing will be given.
 - Songs will also be cut down in number/length.
- Service will be shortened to 45 minutes (from 1 hour) to decrease time for potential exposure.
- In the event of Communion Sunday:
 - Communion will be served in pre-packaged single serving units as opposed to served individually through dismissal and personal delivery via staff/lead team.
 - Only one person will touch communion bags prior to serving and will sanitize before and after.
