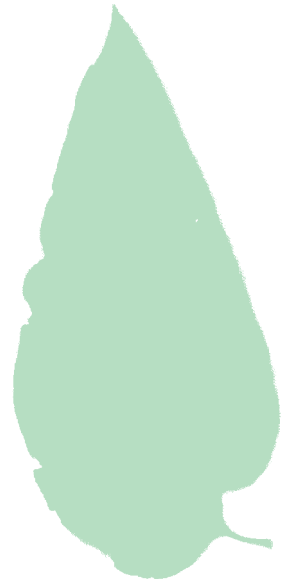
Invest in a devastated community.

RETREET's main planting events take place over the course of a weekend. We focus on making service as fun as it is rewarding and on doing things the most impactful way. We:

- Host community events that allow volunteers, partners, and local residents to interact.
- Choose large, native trees that are grown locally and provide them at no cost to families.
- Mark utilities and coordinate site visits with arborists before volunteers arrive to determine the best planting locations.
- Train our volunteers in proper planting techniques.
- Supply tree care information to recipients and follow up with them to ensure long-term success.

The trees we plant gain value every year as they grow, providing increased benefits for their caretakers. The impact of our work will be felt for generations to come in the communities we serve.
