

For adult & kid costumes

for middle

Tunic or Gown

Materials

- solid-colored fabric or bed sheet
- sewing machine and thread

- fabric marking pen
- thick satin cord or rope

Standard Supplies

- fabric scissors
- tape measure

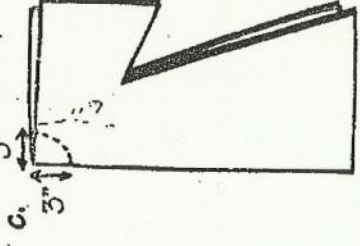
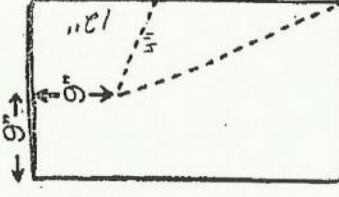
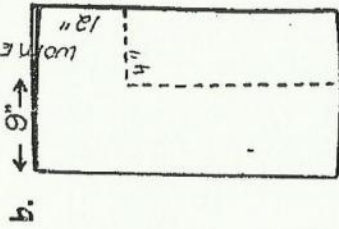
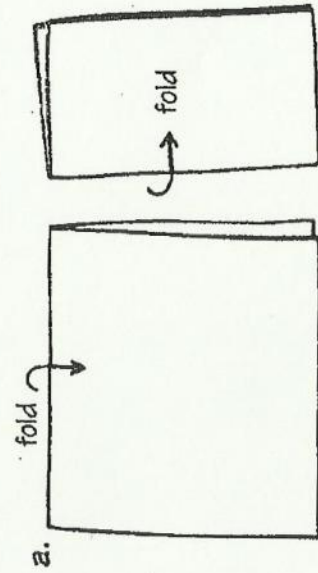
Instructions:

- Measure from your shoulder to the length you want your Tunic or Gown to be. Multiply the number by two.
- Cut fabric the length of the number.
- With right sides together, fold fabric with the top and bottom edges together. Then fold again, with the folds to the top and the left (sketch a).
- Measure 9 inches (22.5 cm) from the left fold and 9 inches (22.5 cm) from the top fold and mark with fabric marking pen. (This measurement fits an average size woman. Adjust as needed.)
- For Tunic: Draw a line from the mark straight down. Then draw another line from the mark straight to the right for sleeve (sketch b). For Gown: Draw an angled line from the mark to the bottom right corner of fabric and another line at an angle to the right for sleeve (sketch b).
- Cut out on lines through all thicknesses of fabric.

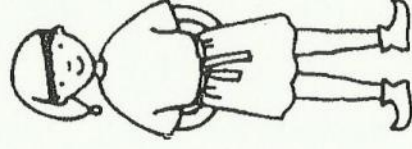
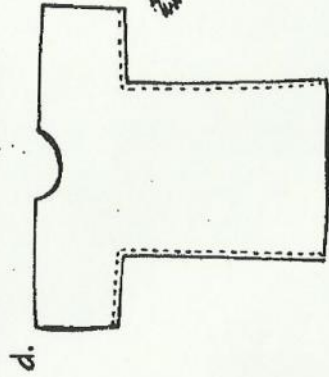
- Cut a neck opening 3 inches (7.5 cm) from folded corner (sketch c).
- Unfold costume and pull on over head. Adjust length of sleeves or costume, if necessary.
- Fold costume, right sides together with fold at top of sleeves. Sew side seams and under arms (sketch d).
- Turn costume right side out. You may cut neckline in a V shape for gown.
- Tie a satin cord around waist for a royal costume. Tie rope around waist for a peasant or crafts-person costume.

Simple Tunic or Gown for a Small Child

Use a solid-colored pillow case for costume. Cut a neckhole in the short seam of pillowcase. Cut arm holes in both sides near the top corners (sketch e). Cut open end in a jagged pattern. Child slips costume on through open end of pillow case, puts head through neckline hole and arms through arm holes. Tie with cord or rope around waist.
