



Scottish American Society of Central Florida Scottish Arts Scholarship Criteria

The Scottish American Society of Central Florida (SASCF) has established a scholarship program for preserving and promoting Scottish arts. Scholarships awarded will be determined by a committee of the SASCF based on the availability of funds and the merit of the applicant's proposal. The recipients will be chosen without regard to sex, race, age, marital status, sexual orientation, disability, religion, national or ethnic origin.

Criteria

1. Scholarships may be awarded to recipients who wish to increase their knowledge and/or skills preserving and promoting Scottish arts. Examples of the target Scottish arts are: piping, drumming, Scottish dancing, harping, painting, etc. This is not an exhaustive list, other skills and arts will be considered.
2. Scholarship applicants shall live in Orange, Seminole and the contiguous counties of Central Florida. An exception to the geographic criteria may be made for an applicant who has made significant volunteer contribution to the Central Florida Highland Games. The applicant must have a SASCF sponsor that can verify the applicant's volunteer contribution in writing.
3. Scholarship applicants shall apply no less than 60 days before the funds are needed. The SASCF Board of Directors (BOD) may consider reimbursement to an applicant for a class already attended if special circumstances warrant consideration.
4. Scholarship recipients and the scholarship amount awarded shall be determined by a committee of the SASCF with the approval of the SASCF President, and notification to the Treasurer. These actions will be reported to the SASCF BOD. Under normal circumstances, the committee shall award no more than \$1000 to any applicant. The SASCF BOD may consider approving more than \$1000 if special circumstances warrant consideration. The scholarship funds will be sent directly to the institution the recipient is attending. The SASCF BOD may consider approving sending the funds directly to the recipient if special circumstances warrant consideration.
5. The recipient must volunteer a minimum of 10 hours to the SASCF and be willing to share their newly acquired knowledge and/or skills with the SASCF.
6. The SASCF will publish a list of the Scottish Arts Scholarship recipients on the SASCF Web site.
