

AUDITION GUIDE: *DRAGONS LOVE TACOS*

PREPARING YOUR DANCE AUDITION

- **EVERYONE** will be asked to complete the dance portion of the audition!
- The first half of the audition dance combination will be available on Sign Up Genius approximately two weeks before the audition. We recommend spending a few minutes learning this part of the combination so that you can feel confident and comfortable on the day of auditions!
- We do NOT expect perfection, and of course will leave some time during the audition to clarify any questions you might have about the combination.
- The choreographer will teach the second part of the dance combination on the day of auditions to get a sense of how people auditioning learn choreography. (See below under Day of the Audition for more thoughts about the dance portion of auditions!)

PREPARING FOR SCENES (Sides) AND PANTOMIME

- Actors will be asked to prepare scenes (called “sides”) and/or a pantomime (scene without words), depending on which characters they are interested in playing. You may choose to prepare for just one character, or for all of them!
- **For SCENES:** Please be familiar with the material, but do not feel like it needs to be memorized. You want to be able to look up from your script now and then while you are auditioning. Also be ready to try a different way of reading the scene if the director gives you some direction!
- **For PANTOMIME:** You have 1-2 minutes to fill with one of the three scenarios! Practice in front of friends & family so they can tell you if your movements are clear and understandable. You want to tell a clear, energetic story with your body!
- You may also want to **check out a script** from the Box Office to help you familiarize yourself with the show. Scripts can be checked out for one week at a time. Box office hours are M-F 10am-5pm. Scripts will NOT be available for check out during that time frame. Please bring a \$10 deposit in the form of cash or check. NO RENTALS MAY LEAVE THE BUILDING THE WEEK BEFORE AUDITIONS. Civic is CLOSED 11/24-26 and 12/22-1/3.

2 - Please prepare ONE of the following given circumstances to pantomime in one to two-minute timeframe.

Please think bold, energetic and detailed movement with emotion behind the situation. You can use blocks in the audition room to add to your pantomime, but no props please.

Situation One: You are in a haunted house, there is spooky things behind each door. Suddenly, you need to escape and get out quick! Use the space to crawl, jump, and leap out of the house.

Situation two: You are constructing the perfect taco, when you take a bite, you realize there is extremely hot salsa on the taco. How do you react to the heat?

Situation three: You are opening birthday gifts! One gift is something that is very smelly, old and disgusting; one gift is super large and heavy; one gift is a scary animal.

AUDITION FORM

- Please fill out the Online Google Form AT LEAST 48 hours before your audition. You can find it here: <https://forms.gle/zq1L7tAqVW1wLYfW9>
- It is EXTREMELY important that you look at the proposed rehearsal schedule BEFORE you fill out your audition form to determine where you might have potential conflicts. Fewer conflicts are always better, but we understand that people have other commitments and are willing to work around a reasonable number of conflicts that are stated on the Audition Form.
 - Directors & Stage Managers use this information to create a rehearsal schedule maximizing our limited rehearsal time. Conflicts added AFTER the audition process WILL NOT be accepted, because it is extremely detrimental to the entire team.
 - Conflicts during tech week or performances will not be accepted.
 - Be sure to also look carefully at the PERFORMANCE SCHEDULE: Dragons Love Tacos has THREE school shows during the day, in addition to regular evening/weekend performances.

DAY OF THE AUDITION: WHAT TO BRING

- A water bottle
- Wear comfortable clothes that you can MOVE in. Either wear or bring close-toed shoes for the dance audition. Some kind of dance shoe is recommended (jazz, ballet, etc.), but any athletic shoe will do.
- A mask that covers your nose and mouth (see Covid Policies at the end of the Audition Guide).

OPTIONAL ITEMS:

- **RESUME:** You do not HAVE to bring a resume, but it can be helpful to the Production Team if you have one. Don't stress about format for your Civic audition. We understand that many people auditioning will not necessarily have a great deal of experience. Items to list on your resume:
 - Your name and contact information
 - Shows you have done (title of show, character you played, name of theatre company)
 - Training you have had (classes at Civic, voice lessons, dance classes, etc.)
 - Other performance experience/skills (choirs, instruments, etc.)
- **HEADSHOT:** This is not required, but again can be helpful to the Production Team. ANY head & shoulders shot will do. Color or black & white are both fine. We may also take a picture of each audition group on the day of auditions.

DAY OF THE AUDITION: ARRIVAL

- Plan to arrive well before your audition time (15-20 minutes) to allow time for traffic, parking, finding your way through the building, and getting settled.
- Metered parking around the building is free on the weekends and evenings after 5pm (the Monroe Center meters are an exception). There is an Ellis Lot on Library street across from the building, but it can be expensive. Please leave yourself plenty of time for parking, especially if you are unfamiliar with the area.
- You will enter through the MAIN Lobby doors, on Library street, across from the Ellis Lots. Look for signs directing you to this door!
- As soon as you enter the building, there will be a check-in desk where some lovely volunteers will make sure that you have filled out your online audition form, have you fill out a name tag, and answer any questions you might have.
- There will be chairs and a few table set up in the Upper & Lower lobby so that you can sit and relax before your audition! There are bathrooms available in the Lower Lobby, and a drinking fountain (though we recommend you bring a water bottle with you).

DAY OF THE AUDITION: YOUR AUDITION

- We will take people in their reserved time-slot group into the audition room and have everyone sit in the line of chairs against the back wall of the theatre. (Auditions will take place ONSTAGE for the best possible ventilation.)
- Someone from the team usually introduces everyone on the audition panel — this will include the director(s), stage manager(s), music director(s), choreographer(s), and sometimes an intern or other staff member.
- We will do the dance audition FIRST. The choreographer will show you the steps, practice with you, and give you a few opportunities to rehearse the combination as a group, with the music.
- After a few times through the combination, the choreographer will split the group into 2-3 smaller groups, and have you show what you have learned. DO NOT PANIC if you “mess up” or can’t perform the entire combination perfectly. THAT IS OK! While some roles do require strong dancers, for many roles we are just looking at your potential. Have fun, smile a lot, and don’t spend any time comparing yourself to others.
- Then we will go through what everyone has prepared for their audition (scenes/sides and pantomimes)!

DAY OF THE AUDITION: AFTER THE AUDITION

- Once the audition panel has seen EVERYONE on Saturday, they will select a few people that they need to see again for Callbacks. A Callback will either be an email or phone call from the production team, probably the day AFTER general auditions have concluded.
- If you do not receive an email or phone call, it does not necessarily mean you are not cast, but it does mean that the team does not need to see you again before we cast the production.
- If you are asked to the Callback, there MAY be another dance combination to learn, as well as more pantomime and reading from the script.
- After Callbacks, the team usually needs a few days to complete casting. Those who are cast will receive a phone call from the stage manager or director. We wait until AFTER we have received confirmation from everyone who is cast before publicly posting a cast list.

AFTER THE AUDITION: WHAT IF I’M NOT CAST?

- Once we have confirmed a cast, those who are not cast will receive an email letting them know that the process is complete and we did not have a place for them this time. Please know that we will be seeing a large group for *DRAGONS LOVE TACOS*, and while we would love to work with everyone, we will have to make many difficult choices in the best interest of the productions.
- But don’t lose heart! There are MANY ways to get involved at Civic! We are always looking for volunteers: ushering, backstage work, costume shop & scene shop assistants, and administrative help! To volunteer at Civic, please fill out the volunteer form on our website at grct.org/volunteers.
- We also teach a wide variety of classes for ages 4-adult. We have Acting, Musical Theatre, Dance, Production & Technical classes for all levels of experience! Taking a class is a great way for you to hone your skills, get to know Civic, and discover & nurture hidden talents! We even offer audition classes for children & adults, if you want to feel more prepared for your next audition experience. Thank-you for your interest in auditioning at Civic Theatre — we know that it can be a daunting process, especially the first time. We try to make it as painless as possible, and please know that every single person on the audition panel is rooting for you! We WANT to see you succeed! Our volunteers - both onstage & off - are the backbone of Civic, and we look forward to adding you to the family.

IMPORTANT COVID SAFETY INFORMATION

The current mask policy, per the Civic Theatre Board of Directors, states:

When Kent County is in a Substantial or High Transmission zone:

- ☐ All backstage and booth crew and production staff are always required to wear masks. Exceptions will be made for Stage Managers who are making calls.
- ☐ Masks are not required for vaccinated performers when on-stage. Vaccinated performers are strongly encouraged to wear masks backstage and in rehearsal when feasible
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- ☐ Proof of vaccination will be required to be unmasked in indoor rehearsal halls or when performing on-stage indoors.

When Kent County is in a Low or Moderate Transmission zone:

- ☐ Masks are optional for all cast, crew, and production staff. Masking will be encouraged when possible, during rehearsals and off-stage during performances.

What does this mean for auditions, rehearsals, and performances?

FOR AUDITIONS: We will be asking **EVERYONE**, regardless of vaccination status, to wear masks the *entire time they are in the building*.

Auditionees/Performers who are **NOT** vaccinated should understand that they will be asked to remain masked at all times during auditions, rehearsals, and performances while Kent County is in a Substantial or High Transmission zone without exception.

Auditionees/Performers who **ARE** vaccinated should still be prepared to mask as often as possible during rehearsals, backstage, and in the dressing rooms – especially while Kent County is in the Substantial and High transmission zone.

PROOF OF VACCINATION WILL BE REQUIRED PRIOR TO THE BEGINNING OF REHEARSAL FOR THOSE WISHING TO PERFORM WITHOUT MASKS.
