



Texas Guiding Principles

- **Protecting health care workers** who fill a critical role in caring for and preserving the lives of COVID-19 patients and maintaining the health care infrastructure for all who need it.
- **Protecting front-line workers** who are at greater risk of contracting COVID-19 due to the nature of their work providing critical services and preserving the economy.
- **Protecting vulnerable populations** who are at greater risk of severe disease and death if they contract COVID-19.
- Mitigating heath inequities due to factors such as demographics, poverty, insurance status and geography.
- **Data-driven allocations** using the best available scientific evidence and epidemiology at the time, allowing for flexibility for local conditions.
- **Geographic diversity** through a balanced approach that considers access in urban and rural communities and in affected ZIP codes.
- **Transparency** through sharing allocations with the public and seeking public feedback.

COVID-19 Critical Population Update Phase 1A Healthcare Workers Definition – First Tier

- 1. Hospital staff working directly with patients who are positive or at high risk for COVID-19. Includes:
 - a. Physicians, nurses, respiratory therapists and other support staff (custodial staff, etc.)
 - b. Additional clinical staff providing supporting laboratory, pharmacy, diagnostic and/or rehabilitation services
- 2. Long-term care staff working directly with vulnerable residents. Includes:
 - a. Direct care providers at nursing homes, assisted living facilities, and state supported living centers
 - b. Physicians, nurses, personal care assistants, custodial, food service staff
- 3. EMS providers who engage in 9-1-1 emergency services like pre-hospital care and transport
- 4. Home health care workers, including hospice care, who directly interface with vulnerable and high-risk patients
- 5. Residents of long-term care facilities

TIER 2



COVID-19 Critical Population Update Phase 1A Healthcare Workers Definition – Second Tier

- 1. Staff in outpatient care offices who interact with symptomatic patients. Includes:
 - a. Physicians, nurses, respiratory therapists and other support staff (custodial staff, etc.).
 - b. Clinical staff providing diagnostic, laboratory, and/or rehabilitation services
 - c. Non 9-1-1 transportation for routine care
- 2. Direct care staff in freestanding emergency medical care facilities and urgent care clinics.
- Community pharmacy staff who may provide direct services to clients, including vaccination or testing for individuals who may have COVID.
- 4. Public health and emergency response staff directly involved in administration of COVID testing and vaccinations.
- 5. Last responders who provide mortuary or death services to decedents with COVID-19. Includes:
 - Embalmers and funeral home workers who have direct contact with decedents
 - Medical examiners and other medical certifiers who have direct contact with decedents.
- 6. School nurses who provide health care to students and teachers.

As of March 2, 2021:

School and Child Care Personnel Now Eligible To Be Vaccinated


With the <u>federal directive</u>, the following education and child care personnel are now eligible to be vaccinated in Texas:

- Those who work in pre-primary, primary, and secondary schools;
- Head Start and Early Head Start programs (including teachers, staff, and bus drivers); and
- Those who work as or for licensed child care providers, including center-based and family care providers.

Third Floor of Gregory Gym (GRE)




Command Center

Parking


Brazos Garage (BRG) 210 E. Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd.

Parking is free in BRG for vaccine operations (for staff, volunteers, patients, etc.), so you do not need to pay, pull a ticket, get validation, etc. If the parking arms are down when you leave, push the button to talk to a Parking & Transportation staff member, explain that you were working the vaccine clinic, and they will raise the arm to let you through.



Brazos to GRE

Head west from Brazos to get to Speedway; follow this north past JES and the PCL, cross 21st Street, and GRE will be on the right.

Requested Dress Code

General Staff: Please wear comfortable shoes and clothing.

GRE can run cool or warm, so it is recommended to dress in layers, bring a light jacket or sweater, etc. You may be needed inside the building or outside, so keep an eye on the weather, bring an umbrella and sunscreen, etc.

Clinical Staff: Please wear scrub bottoms with a scrub top or your UT Health Austin T-shirt.

Required PPE will be provided on-site.

Arrival Time

Arrival time for your shift will be: AM: 7:30am arrival PM: 12:30pm arrival

It is very important that you arrive on time for your shift.

Appointments begin at 8am and end at 4:20pm.

Stations will be closed from 12pm – 1pm for lunch.

Food

There is a water fountain with a bottle refill option in GRE.

There are food and beverage options in the surrounding buildings (JES, SAC).

Please plan ahead to bring what you will need and/or to have time before or after your shift to get food. You may not have time during your shift to leave the building, wait in line, etc.
